Helping to make your workplace safer

Too many New Zealanders continue to be injured at work. We know you want to make your workplace safer for your people, but sometimes you need a hand to make improvements.

Businesses in the healthcare and social assistance sector have told us that financial barriers can get in the way of making health and safety improvements. We want to help; we're offering a subsidy to reduce the cost of purchasing aid equipment.

Our offer

If you're a healthcare business with 6 to 99 employees, you may be eligible for a workplace injury prevention subsidy.

Aid equipment, such as transfer belts and mobile hoists, can help to significantly reduce the risk of injury to your employees, when they are moving and handling people.

We'll contribute 50% of the cost of purchasing aid equipment up to a maximum amount, depending on the size of your business:

| Business size | Business size definition | Our maximum contribution* |
|--|--|---------------------------|
| Small - Small/Medium (6-49 employees) | \$277k - \$2,493k liable earnings | \$400 |
| Medium (50-99 employees) | \$2,494k - \$5,012k liable earnings | \$1,800 |

Our contribution varies according to the size of your business. For example, a medium-sized business has more employees moving and handling people and therefore may have a greater need for equipment.

We're offering a workplace injury prevention subsidy for businesses like yours in the healthcare and social assistance sector to reduce the cost of purchasing aid equipment.



If the aid equipment costs \$1,350, our contribution for each business size would be:

| Business size | Equipment cost | Our contribution | Note |
|--|----------------|------------------|--|
| Small – Small/ Medium (6-49 employees) | \$1,350 | \$400 | Payment capped at maximum for this business size |
| Medium (50-99 employees) | \$1,350 | \$675 | Payment capped at 50% of cost |
